

How to Import Your Dahlia Collection from Microsoft Excel

Importing your Dahlia collection from Excel is quick and easy—it usually takes 3–5 minutes. You can import:

- Your Dahlia collection list
- Your yearly records (if they are in Excel)

To ensure smooth import, follow these steps.

Step 0: Decide what to import.

- Dahlia collection only
- Dahlia collection + yearly records

Step 1: Prepare Your File

Make a copy of your original Excel file and use this copy for the import process to keep your original safe. Structure your file correctly so the system can read your data without errors.

Step 2: Name Your Sheet

At the bottom of your Excel window, you will see the sheet name (usually 'Sheet1'). Right-click the name, choose Rename, and type: Dahlias.

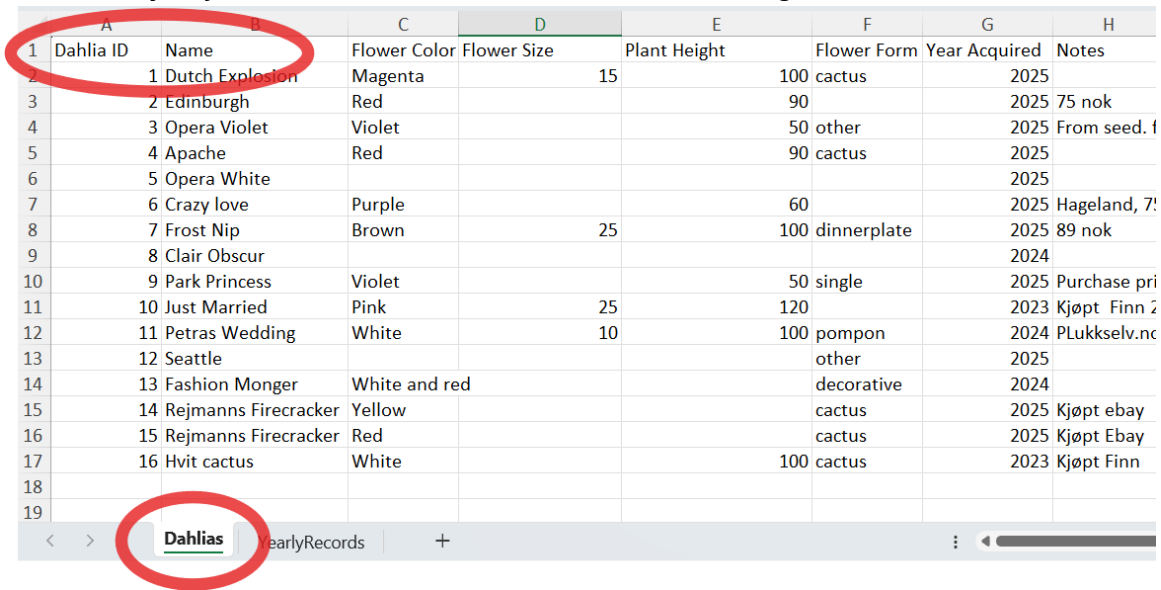
If you are going to import the yearly notes, rename Sheet2: YearlyRecords

Step 3: Rename Your Columns in the Dahlias sheet.

Your sheet should have at least these two columns:

Column Name	What It Contains
Dahlia ID	A unique ID for each Dahlia variety. This can be numbers (1, 2, 3...) or your own codes.
Name	The name of your Dahlia variety.

Additional variables in the Dahlias sheet

It is possible to add additional variables as well by naming column names. The following variables are available for upload:

Column Name	What It Contains
Flower Color	Color of flower
Flower Size	Size of flower, just the number
Plant Height	Height of the flower, just the number
Flower Form	Cactus, pompon, decorative etc.
Year Acquired	The year the plant was acquired
Notes	Short notes in text form

Step 4: Rename your columns in the YearlyRecords sheet.

This step only applies if you are going to import yearly records.

Your sheet should have at least these two columns:

Column Name	What It Contains
Dahlia ID	A unique ID for each Dahlia variety. This can be numbers (1, 2, 3...) or your own codes.
Year	The year for the specific record. It is possible to upload records for more than one year per Dahlia variety

Additional variables in the YearlyRecords Sheet

It is possible to add additional variables as well by naming column names. The following variables are available for upload:

Column Name	What It Contains
tubers_in_storage	Number
clumps_in_storage	Number
date_planted	Date*
date_sprouted	Date*
date_first_flower	Date*
seeds_collected	Number
Notes	Short notes in text form

*Acceptable date formats are:

YYYY-MM-DD (ex. 2025-03-15)

MM/DD/YYYY (ex. 03/15/2025).

DD.MM.YYYY (ex. 15.03.2025)

Troubleshooting

When the import fails, these are the two most common errors.

- The sheet is not named correctly. To ensure a proper import, ensure that you have followed step 2.
- The names in the columns and in the sheets are case-sensitive, and this might cause import errors.
